INFORMATION

The small loop of the trail is 6.7 km long. The longer one is 9.7 km and also offers a detour to the "Stréissel" nature reserve.

Simply follow the signs with the Giant's hat or the BB1 indication. They will show you the way.





The official starting point is at the football field next to the Parc Merveilleux. How to get there?

- By bus: line 550 (bus stop: Parc Merveilleux) More information at: mobiliteit.lu
- With the free shuttle from Bettembourg train station
 (Always on Sundays and public holidays; during the season of the Parc Merveilleux from the end of March to the beginning of October)

- With the e-bikes of the Vël'Ok regional network More information at: bettembourg.lu/e-bikes
- On foot: from Bettembourg train station it is 2.2 km to the starting point. The walking time is about half an hour.

The trail is also accessible by bike, pram or wheelchair. If there are any detours or other disruptions, information will be provided via the municipality's Facebook page.
